Status represents another form of inequality - Ending, esteem, respect, prestige, can involve physical, intelligence, beauty, occupations, which are classified in order of prestige - corporate lawyers, financial experts collectors of garbage and janitors. When sociologists speak of the social class, they refer to a group of individuals that occupy a similar position in the economy production system. Within this system occupation is very important because it provides financial rewards, stability and benefit as healthcare. Are people in similar positions, aware of each other? General terms, yes. Marx felt that the lack of power of workers was the source of class base of the conflict class, Marx argued that owners and workers developed ideas, understandings about their positions and this Marx called class consciousness . When the owners convinced workers that their situations were a compatible Marx called it false consciousness. Although Marx spoke mainly about the two large classes to owners and workers for him he was also aware of a third category he called a small bourgeoisie literally small middle class and these were owners of small businesses. Finding a location for this group was difficult because they did not have the power if the owners and at the same time had control over their work and the salary, to the contrary of the workers.
